A wordless picture book exploring the woods at night armed with a torch. The illustrations cleverly explore the light and dark theme.




#### Brown, Peter - My Teacher is a Monster!


Monty the lion is very proud of his mane and the Meerkats love to play in it. But someone else wants to get close too. Great use of language and good use of suspense.

This series of phonic readers helps develop early reading skills. The rhyming story will help the children further in predicting the sentence. Space and aliens are always a popular theme.




