A secret agent spider must protect a birthday cake from a pesky fly who wants to eat it. Bright cheerful illustrations complement the story.

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# Collins, Ross – What Does an Anteater Eat?

Anteater is so hungry he can't remember what he likes to eat. Join anteater on his journey as he asks the other animals what he normally eats. There are clues all the way along which children will soon spot and along with the bright bold illustrations makes this a perfect picture book to read aloud.



#### Davies, Benji – Grandma Bird

Noi isn't at all sure about staying at Grandma's. Grandma boils seaweed for soup, and there's not much to do on the tiny island where she lives. But then Noi is involved with a dramatic rescue and learns to appreciate his Grandma and her island home. A tender and heart warming story from the world of "The Storm Whale".



#### Gravett, Emily – Cyril and Pat

Cyril the squirrel is terrified when he is chased by a very aggressive dog all through the town. Pat the rat comes to the rescue with the help of his huge family and so proving that a rat and a squirrel can be the best of friends despite their differences. A book about understanding differences and the importance of standing up for your friends.



#### Gray, Kes – You're Called What?

In the Ministry of Silly Animal Names there is a very long queue of strange creatures. An extremely funny, tongue twisting story full of weird and wonderful real creatures and facts at the end that will amaze.

George assumes he can't do lots of things without even trying until his friend bear comes to the rescue. A great story about having the confidence to try new things and being positive. Y


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# Henn, Sophy – Super Duper you


# Johnson, Richard – Once Upon A Snowstorm


# McLaren, Meg – The Station Mouse
